CHEROKEE HISTORICAL ROAD TRIP

At 8:15 on October 5th the Early Ford V-8 Club of Tulsa made their fall road trip to Muskogee and Tahlequah, Oklahoma. The first stop was in Haskell at an old remodeled DX service station where we took pictures of the V8's making the trip.

Then traveling on to Muskogee where we arrived at the Five Civilized Tribes Museum. We were provided with a tour guide that first explained the history of the building which was built in 1875 as a facility for the tribes superintendency. There is a Native American art gallery displaying art of many Five Civilized Tribe heritage.

From there the group traveled to the Red Lobster for a group lunch together to discuss the interesting things and information received at the museum.

Following lunch, we traveled to Park Hill where the Murrel (Hunter) Home is located. This home was built in 1845 in Indian Territory by George Murrell, a wealthy white planter and merchant who married Minerva Ross, the niece of a prominent Cherokee leader John Ross. The building was frequently raided by forces of both the Union and Confederacy. It is the only local home to survive the civil war conflict. The home has been restored to its original stature and was declared a Nation Historic Landmark in 1974. All of the original furnishings have been acquired; except for two pieces which have be located, but the home has been unable to acquire them. In 2018 the home was officially changed to the Hunter Home.

From the home the club travelled one mile away to the John Ross Museum. John Ross was Principal Chief of the Cherokees during the Trail of Tears. The museum is small and there is no charge for admission. The museum gives a close-up look into the life and leadership of this great Cherokee. The museum is housed in a restored 1913 schoolhouse building.

Leaving the museum, we traveled to our hotel for a short nap and at 6:00 PM we will all start gathering in the lobby break room for drinks, snacks and discuss what to do about dinner. The consensus was that we will enjoy the snack as it was a long day.

The following morning the ladies slept in, and the men kicked tires and had breakfast at your leisure. At 10:00 Gayle Ross a master of the age-old craft of Cherokee Indian storytelling and history of the Cherokees spent a little over an hour telling us stories of the Cherokee people.

About 11:30 we all traveled to the Maracas Mexican Restaurant east of town. Then drive through the campus of Northeastern State University. Then travel home, via old highway 51.

Those making the trip were: Jim Ayers and Grandson Brock in Jim's 1956 Ford Convertible, Layton & Debi Dozier in their 1940 Ford Convertible, Doug & Cindy Stackpole in their 1939 Ford Convertible, Jim & Teresa Strode in their 1951 Lincoln and Ralph Johnson in Jim Ayers 1953 Ford Victoria. 
We are trying to divide and conquer this year - as a guideline:

LADIES'CORNER

Tudor Coupe Muffins

- 2 C whole wheat flour
- 1 C sugar
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 C applesauce
- 1/2 C Canola oil
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 C milk
- 3 small ripe bananas
- 1 C mini chocolate chips
- 1/2 C chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 350°. Line 18 muffin tins with paper cupcake liners.

Whisk flour, sugar, baking powder, and soda into a large bowl. Add applesauce, oil, and vanilla. Stir only enough to mix, fold in milk, bananas, chocolate chips, and walnuts in that order. Do not stir excessively. Fill muffin tins to 3/4 full with batter.

Bake 25 - 30 minutes or until an inserted toothpick comes out clean.

Thanksgiving Left over Casserole <<<

1 12 oz can evaporated milk

1/4 tsp salt

1/4 tsp onion powder

2 Tbsp all-purpose flour

1 C water

1/4 tsp ground black pepper

2 Tbsp butter

1 C finely crushed herb seasoned dry bread stuffing mix

- 1 C cooked, diced turkey meat
- 1 C shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 C leftover mashed potatoes

Preheat oven to 350°. Lightly grease a 9x13 baking dish. Melt 3 Tbsp butter in saucepan over low heat. Blend in the flour. Stir sauce over low heat for 5 min. In a separate saucepan over low heat, melt 2 Tbsp butter. Blend in the dry stuffing mix. Place the turkey in the prepared baking dish. Pour the sauce over the turkey, sprinkle with cheddar cheese. Spread mashed potatoes over cheese. Top mashed potatoes with stuffing mixture. Bake 45 minutes in preheated oven.
